INSTRUCTIONS & VIDEO INTERVIEW QUESTIONS FOR BREAKOUT GROUP REPRESENTATIVES

At the beginning of breakout session three, and again for breakout session four, each group must nominate one person to represent your group in a 2-3 minute video interview. **The nominated interviewee should be given the questions below at the start of each session to help them prepare.** It is up to facilitators and groups whether you want to work together to help your representative prepare for their 2-3 minute interview. It is also up to you if you would like to use the same representative for both sessions.

If other group members wish to be interviewed and/or interview someone, please come to our video interview corner in the Doing Development Differently Marketplace from 4 pm on Wednesday 15 March!

Video crews will start arriving in breakout rooms from around 15 minutes before the end of session three and 30 minutes before the end of session four. **Each crew needs to do one interview per group for three separate groups so please help them to move fast between groups by being ready for your interview!**

Interviews from sessions three and four will be edited into one 15-minute film to screen at the beginning of plenary session five. While the questions below for each session are set, and the crews will try to minimize variation to help make the video compilation team's challenging job easier, please do be creative in how you approach this sharing exercise, experiment and have fun!

QUESTIONS FOR SESSION 3: Into the Sandpit – What's your problem? 2.00 pm – 4.00pm, Wednesday 15 March

1. What was the single biggest takeaway for you from this last session?
2. Can you briefly describe the 'problem' (or problems) your group identified? (*You could, for instance, state the 'problem' then explain whose problem you consider it to be, what makes it complex (or simple), and whether it relates more to a thematic/technical challenge or a methodological issue.*)
3. Your group is [*insert theme*]. How did that theme influence the process your group went through to identify your problem(s)?
4. Are you optimistic your group will be able to 'solve' this problem in the next breakout session?

QUESTIONS FOR SESSION 4: Into the Sandpit – Solve your problem 8.30 am – 10.30 am, Thursday 16 March

1. What was something that really surprised you in this last session?
2. Can you briefly describe the tools and process your group applied to develop solutions?
3. What could the group do differently the next time around?
